





This growing youth development workforce brings a wide range of personal and professional experience to the team, including social work, public health, public policy, law enforcement, education, direct services, & community organizing.



BUILDING REGIONAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT NETWORKS

- Youth Development Networks (YDNs) are designed to improve access to free, comprehensive, and culturally responsive youth development services by coordinating low barrier and high access networks of care.
- In 2023, DYD onboarded community leaders with the expertise to support community outreach, engagement, and planning across our three initial YDN regions: Antelope Valley, East LA, and South LA.
- The initial YDN regions were identified based on geographic analysis of the highest Justice Equity Needs and other relevant measures indicating high youth development needs. In 2024 and beyond, DYD will expand to additional communities informed by data and engagement with community and other partners.





EXPANDING COMMUNITY-BASED ALTERNATIVES TO SYSTEM INVOLVEMENT

- Diversion offers youth the opportunity to participate in supportive and restorative services as an alternative to traditional legal system involvement.
- DYD funds a regional network of community-based providers and coordinate partnerships with law enforcement agencies with the goal of equitably reducing arrest in communities most impacted by system involvement.
- By 2024, DYD plans to expand to approximately 30 additional diversion program locations.



ADVANCING TRANSFORMATIVE MENTORSHIP

In 2023, DYD launched and began to expand a Credible Messenger program to support incarcerated youth with trauma-responsive and culturally-sensitive mentorship.

Designed based on the success of Credible Messenger models across the nation, DYD's community-based Credible Messengers are trusted mentors with personal experience navigating system involvement.






SHARED LEARNING DYD + YJAG STEERING COMMITTEE

- DYD and the Youth Justice Advisory Group hosted five quarterly public Steering Committee meetings to engage partners in planning and feedback related to the vision, values, and recommendations of Youth Justice Reimagined.
- Each quarter, Youth Leaders receive a stipend for their role helping to develop the agenda and facilitate collaborative dialogue.
- The Youth Justice Advisory Group includes workgroups in the following areas: 1) Youth Development Networks, 2) Collaborative Decision-Making, 3) Safe Healing Centers, 4) Gender-Responsive Strategy, 5) Youth Leadership and Engagement, and 5) Legislative Strategy.





SHARED LEARNING CROSS-DEPARTMENT COLLABORATION

DYD is collaborating with a wide range of youth-serving County departments, community partners, justice system partners, and system-impacted youth to design an evidence-informed approach to youth development, including a focus on programming for youth in Juvenile Halls and Camps.

SHARED LEARNING SUPPORTING POLICY CHANGE


DYD is working closely with County Counsel, the Chief Executive Office's Legislative Affairs and Intergovernmental Relations team, and a working group of community & county partners to assess legislative opportunities and draft proposals focused on reducing bias in access to youth diversion, reducing barriers to accessing information and participating in multidisciplinary teams for youth development practitioners, and more.

Held three listening sessions to engage youth and community members about potential policy priorities to help inform our legislative and local policy efforts moving forward.



Convened eleven monthly ad-hoc legislative working group to explore opportunities for legislative strategy related to youth development and Youth Justice Reimagined.

DYD is releasing funding opportunities for Youth Diversion and My Brother & Sister's Keeper programs as well as launching initial Youth Development Networks, including demonstration projects for school-based crisis response, restorative practices, and youth centers. DYD is also planning a Fall 2023 Youth Summit to build a strong foundation for healing-centered approaches to youth development.

DYD is increasing support for system-impacted youth through expanded Credible Messenger mentorship, holistic care coordination for youth in Juvenile Halls and Camps through reentry, and a demonstration project focused on Safe Healing Centers for girls and gender expansive youth.

DYD will expand evaluation, communication, and community engagement, including supporting a process to develop a participatory youth development research framework through listening sessions with youth and partners.

DYD will complete a comprehensive strategic plan and continue to expand opportunities for shared learning and policy change to advance Youth Justice Reimagined.
