## THE IMPACT OF YOUTH DIVERSION IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY

Enrolling in Los Angeles County's Youth Diversion and Development programs helps youth and families thrive and significantly reduces future involvement in the legal system, which benefits us all now and in the future.

95% of youth enrolled in diversion stayed out of trouble with the legal system

Only 5% of youth who enroll in diversion had a petition filed within 12 months \*

Compared to around 20% of youth who did not enroll in the program

\* This result is statistically significant and equitable by race and ethnicity, gender, and age. Enrolling in diversion has the greatest impact on reduced recidivism for youth referred for alleged felonies.

\$40K saved per youth enrolled compared to costs of arrest or court
