The Department of Youth Development is in a season of action and boldness. Although we are only a few months into 2026, our team and partners have been hard at work building an ecosystem of care-first youth development across LA County that grows stronger each day.

This momentum comes during a challenging fiscal period for the County. Like all departments, we are finding creative ways to serve our communities with limited resources. Our budget proposal focuses on operational sustainability while advancing a bold vision for equitable youth services.

We're actively growing our impact where it matters most—from scaling the Reentry Action for Youth program to serve 540 peers, to investing in the renovation of a transition home for girls and gender-expansive youth. We're also bringing restorative practices to 10 pilot schools through our ROOTED program and building stronger partnerships across the County. 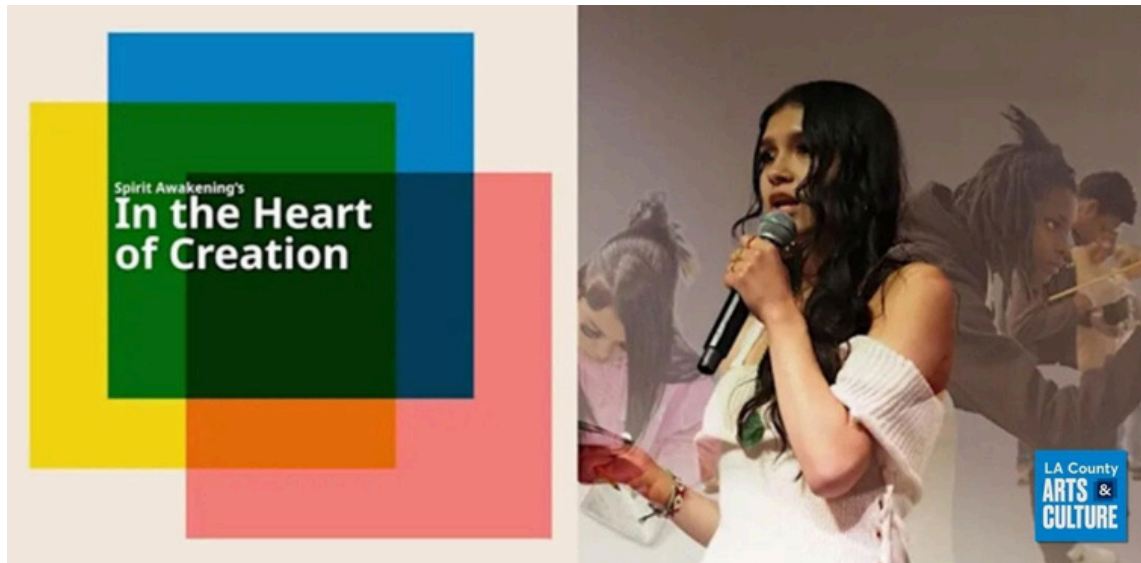
